4. DON BOSCO COLLEGE HISTORY

Don Bosco

Don Bosco lost his father when he was two, an event that shaped his whole life. Growing up without a father's love made him sensitive to young people on the margins, lost and in danger, to whom he became a father; a father to the 'fatherless'.

The gospel image he found most expressive was that of the Good Shepherd who knows his sheep by name and is prepared to give his life for them. In his own life this became, 'For you I study, for you I work, for you I live, for you I am even willing to give my life'. As the burden of caring grew, he gathered around him men and women, willing in similar fashion, to share their lives with the young and the poor. He chose Francis de Sales as patron for his gentleness and patience to guide them.

His life's direction was confirmed by certain recurring dreams, the first of which, at nine years of age, never left him. It describes a field of young people at play and the young Giovanni getting involved with loud words and fists to stop them 'swearing'. A man dressed in a white cloak appears whose face is dazzling. He calls the boy by name and asks him to take charge of the others but says that they can only be won over by gentleness and love. He then points to the lady beside him who takes the boy's hand. She will teach him how to be sensitive to the most troubled hearts.

This then becomes his whole life, this desire to bring the good news of unconditional love to the young and to bring young people to accept Jesus as their closest friend. In the context of education (in the broadest sense), based entirely on 'reason, religion and loving kindness', he found a way to do this.

Don Bosco's way is about presence, about family, about 'being there' for young people sharing time, fun, prayer, encouragement, love. The credo of the Salesian family reads: 'we believe that God awaits us in the young to offer us the grace of serving Him'.

The Salesian Way

Our spirituality is above all a spirituality of the heart that reaches out to people in practical life-supporting and lifeenhancing ways, especially to the young, and among them those most at risk. It is at once contemplative and active. Salesian spirituality always seeks to recognise and uphold the dignity and respect due to all living beings. Anything less is considered a failure of understanding, a failure of spirit and heart. Tendencies to blame and exclude are recognised for what they are and are put aside in favour of attitudes of welcome and hospitality. Joy, like compassion and a gentle spirit, is intentional. There is no place here for the regressive ways of repression and violence, no place for unreasonable harshness or the arrogant selfishness of power. We believe that true spirituality plants seeds of integrity, care, compassion, kindness and happiness in the world and for the world.

Salesians World Wide

We, the Salesians of Don Bosco, formally known as the Society of St Francis of Sales, was founded in 1859 by Saint John Bosco, there are currently 15,298 members in the Salesian Congregation, working in 132 countries around the world. Besides the Society of St. Francis de Sales, John Bosco also founded the Institute of the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians (Salesian Sisters), and the Association of Salesian Cooperators. Saint John Bosco always wanted to have lay people as part of his work and mission. The magnetism of his personality and the attractiveness of his educational philosophy have attracted many lay groups to become part of the Salesian Family. Thirty such groups have been officially recognised that have a total of 4, 02,500 members. These groups live in communion with each other, share the same spirit and, with specifically distinct vocations, continue the mission he began. Don Bosco's Charism continues to inspire people of good will.

Salesian Province of Dimapur

The Salesian province of Dimapur, one of the ten in India, came into existence by bifurcation of the Guwahati Province and was canonically erected on 8th December 1981 with the Rector Major Very Rev. Fr. Egidio Vigano's decree of canonical erection. The inauguration of the Province dedicated to St. Francis de Sales, was held on 18th June 1982 with Fr. Pulingathil Mathew as the first provincial. Late Bishop Alangimattathil Abraham, sdb of Kohima diocese presided over the inaugural ceremony. The province comprises the States of Arunachal Pradesh, Upper Assam, Manipur and Nagaland with an area of 2,55,168 sq. km having a population of 38.4 million. The provincial headquarters was established at Dimapur, a big town and the commercial hub of the state of Nagaland, situated at the boarder of Nagaland and Assam. At present the province has 52 centers and 246 Salesians serve in the province.

Don Bosco College Kohima

Salesians have been present in Kohima for over past 60 years, having established the Christ King Parish from where the confreres opened the present Don Bosco High school in 1971, which has served the people of Kohima Village for the past 41 years. The school has been upgraded into higher secondary level from 1995. The people and the Catholic Elders Association of Kohima Village have made a written request to upgrade the present Higher Secondary School into an Institute of Higher Education (Graduate College), to cater to the needs of the young people of the locality. Hence, Don Bosco College, Kohima came into existence

and it is a gift given by the Salesian Province of Dimapur to the people of Nagaland, to commemorate the bicentenary of the birth of St. John Bosco (1815-2015). It was officially inaugurated and established on 31st August by Rev. Fr. Nestor Guria SDB, Provincial and blessed by Most. Rt. Rev. James Thopill D.D Bishop of the Diocese of Kohima.

Academically, the college is blossoming to a great height. The college takes pride for making a niche in University Ranks by securing gold medals in 2015 and 2016 batches

He was born in August 21, 1960 in Luanco-Gozon, Asturias, Spain; ordained a priest on July 4, 1987, in León.

ELIGIBILITY

Students who have passed 10+2 examination or any other equivalent examination from any recognized University/Board shall be eligible to seek admission to the first semester of the Three Year Degree Pass Course

- a) Students seeking admission in Honours Course must secure 45% total aggregate in 10+2 level or 45% in the concerned subject.
- b) Students who have completed Diploma/Certificate course after passing class10 with minimum duration of two or more years from recognised University/Board, UGC and AICTE are eligible to seek admission to First Semester
- c) Students may shift from Science stream to Commerce, Arts, Commerce stream to Arts provided he/she secured 45% of marks in aggregate in 10+2 level.
- d) Science and Commerce students securing 45% marks in

English in their 10+2 level examination shall also be eligible to take admission to English Honours.

A SIMPLE SEVEN-STEPS ADMISSION PROCESS

- i) Purchase the Application form from the college office
- ii) Submit the filled-in Application form along with the required documents

9. NORMS & GUIDELINES

Attendance

- Regular attendance not only fetches you high score of marks but also is an enriching experience with your classmates and teachers. Therefore, all the students should attend classes regularly. If there are some important and compelling reasons such as family celebration, ill health etc., students can avail leave after obtaining permission from the Principal.
- For every hour, the attendance of students is marked in attendance register by individual course teacher.
- Monthly attendance percentage of students will be displayed on the notice board. In case of any discrepancy, they can get it rectified by contacting the teacher concerned and the Principal within three days. Any request for correction in the attendance after three days will not be entertained.
- After the final attendance list is displayed on the notice board at the end of a semester, any request for correction of attendance will not be accepted.
- Minimum class/subject attendance required to be eligible to sit for any Examination of the college/University is 80%.
- Award/Merit certificates will be given to all who obtain 100% attendance for all the courses.
- Any student, who continuously absents from classes for 10 calendar days without information and intimation, will have his/her name struck off from the college register. The attendance at the first day of class after long vacation/holidays is compulsory and its non-compliance shall incur a fine.
- When absence is caused by unforeseen events, application for leave signed by the student & parent should be submitted to the Principal not later than three days after returning to the class, along with proof for reasons.
- Application for leave of absence may be rejected by the Principal if its genuineness is not satisfactor.

Evaluation System

Semester system will be followed as per Nagaland University directive. Each academic year is divided into two semesters. From June to November are the **Odd Semesters** and from December to May are **Even Semesters**. Every eligible student will take admission into every semester.

Examination Routine and the End Semester Examinations shall be notified by the University, which shall be of 3 hours duration.

A student shall be deemed qualified to appear the End-Semester Examinations only if he/she secures minimum qualifying marks in the internal assessment Tests and maintains 80% Attendance separately in every subject.

The performance of a student will be evaluated on a 30:70 basis i.e. 30 marks for internal assessment and 70 marks for end semester examination. A student should secure a minimum of 45% in the internal assessment, and 45% marks in the end semester exam. 45% of 30 Marks is 13.5 Marks. One should secure a minimum of 14 marks in the Internal Assessment. 45% of 70 Marks is 31.5 Marks. One should secure a minimum of 32 marks in the End-Semester Examination. (14+32=46) One should secure 46 marks to pass the End-Semester Examination.

Continuous internal assessment includes two organized tests and other components such as assignments, presentations, quiz, seminar, etc. Both the Continuous Internal Assessment tests are compulsory to students.

A student who fails to appear for **selection examination** will be debarred from appearing the University Examination. The Principal's decision in this regard will be final and binding.

DBCK ATMOSPHERE

Don Bosco College is a shrine of learning and everyone is expected to create a favourable atmosphere for it.

DRESS CODE

Dress is not about what is handy to wear as boys and girls but influential to wear as **Bosconians**. Hence, students are requested to wear set dress code.

- Black blazer, Black trousers, Black shoes, black socks, black belt, black sweater, with a white collared shirt for Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday
- College T-Shirt for Wednesday, Department T-Shirt for Thursday

APPEARANCE

- Bleaching and colouring of hair is strictly prohibited for both boys and girls. Only black-dye may be used if and when circumstances demand.
- Inappropriate short hair is strictly prohibited for girls.
- Shaved haircut, bald cut (brush-cut over the ears) bald head-cut and growing long hair are strictly prohibited for boys.
- Spiked hair dress and fancy hair styles of any kind are strictly prohibited.
- No students shall keep his/her hair in any manner which can make the hair look unusual or over stylish than the normal student look.
- Tattoos of all kinds are strictly NOT allowed.

FOR FEMALE STUDENTS

• Hair must be neat and clean. Shoulder length hair or longer than shoulder length should be tied up.

- Only one ear-stud per ear is allowed and the ear studs for both ears must be of the same design.
- Ear-studs must be of a simple design and not fanciful.
- Dangling earrings are NOT allowed.

BOSCONIANS

- Bosconians must wear proper uniform and identity card, whenever they come to the college.
- Daily attendance at the start of the college for a short prayer session in the college hall is mandatory.
- The students are expected to be in the college campus during the entire period of the college hours.
- Possession and use of addictive substances like tobacco, supari, pan, etc. are completely forbidden in the College campus.

Regulations

- Students must be present on the re-opening day after every vacation and on the last day before every vacation, major or minor. Those who fail to do shall pay a fine.
- Punctuality is to be observed by all at the college campus. Late comers may be permitted to attend classes on submission of the fine slip. Names of late comers will be posted on the notice board once a month. Repeated late comers will be asked to discontinue from the college.
- Students may not leave the college campus during lecture hours without the permission of the Principal. When such leave is granted a leave-slip will be issued to the student. Students are required to present the leave slip to the college office before leaving the college.
- Usage of **mobile phone is prohibited** in the campus. Any unauthorized use will incur confiscation.

- Students must not join any club or society or involve in any engagements that would interfere with their studies without the prior permission of the Principal.
- Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting within the college, or collect money for any purpose or to circulate among the students any notice or petition of any kind or paste it on the college notice board without the written permission of the Principal.
- Active participation in politics is not compatible with the academic life of students and such students are not expected to indulge in public activities, which are of a political nature.

Classroom Behaviour

- Students shall respect the direction of the teachers. Any disrespect shown to the teachers in the class or outside shall result in serious punishment and even expulsion.
- Students who absent themselves from classes (absent themselves from one or more lectures without permission) will lose attendance for the day. Names of absentees will be posted on the notice board on the following day and clarification, if any, should be made on the same day. Repeated absentees will be asked to discontinue from the college or they may be detained in the selection exam.
- Students may not leave the classroom without the permission or until the teacher has left the room or asked the class to disperse.
- Proper class room behaviour is expected from all. Eating, chewing, littering of rubbish, spiting, writing on desk, wall, black boards etc., are strictly forbidden.
- Students who leave classrooms should get a leave-slip from the teacher. Students who leave class rooms without

permission are admitted to the class only after obtaining permission from the Principal.

Fines

Non-compliance with any of the rules and regulations of the college regarding general campus culture such as uniform, camera phone, attendance, late coming etc., shall incur a fine as reformative/transformative measure.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDUCES (SOP) FOR STUDENTS

A. After admission process

- After payment of fee, submission of original documents, signing of contract and orientation, every first year students or a transfer student is expected to do the following at the college office
- Apply for the college identification card
- Confirm all data entered in the student profile is up to date and correct
- Enroll yourself in a College club and association of your choice

B. Leaving college

• After finishing college or in case of a transfer/withdrawal, a student is expected to do the following:

- Write an application to the principal, requesting for required documents (eg: transfer certificate, character certificate, provisional certificate and return of all original documents submitted) and submit to the college office.
- Collect the clearance form from the college office and get required signature from the HOD and Librarian

- If a student wishes to take Transfer Certificate during the year he/She has to clear all fees of the installment period and if the TC is applied for after three months, then the entire fees of the year will have to be cleared.
- A fee of Rs. 100 has to be paid for Transfer Certificates and Rs. 50 each for other certificates.
- No Certificates will be handed over to anyone else other than the candidate, parents or one who produces any original certificate of the candidate.
- Collect all the documents on the given date from the college office.

C. During Examinations

Regarding Admit cards

- Collect clearance slip from the college office.
- Get required signatures from the HOD and Librarian
- Signatures will only be given if the student has required attendance, no fees due, and no library fines or no books to be returned.
- Return the duly signed clearance form to the college office & collect the Admit card

Discipline regarding examination

- Report to college at least 30 minutes before the examination time
- All students are expected to be in the examination hall 5 minutes before the examination begin
- Bags, Mobile Phones or electronic gadgets are not allowed inside the examination hall

- Borrowing of stationery is not allowed in the examination hall
- Students are not supposed to write their names in the answer script, rather write only the college/university registration & roll number
- Students will not be allowed to enter the examination hall, 15 minutes after the commencement of exams
- Doubt clarification of the question paper will be done at the first 15 minutes only
- Malpractices in examinations will lead to cancellation of all the examinations and expulsion from the College.

D. Student Support

Loss of identity card

Request for replacement of lost identity card must be given in writing to the Principal. A new card may be issued on the payment of Rs. 100.

Loss/Damage of library book

After the matter is informed by the student to the librarian, s/he will issue a memo to the college office directing him/her to collect the required amount of money for the book. The student should make the payment at the cash counter

Damage to college property

Any damage to the college property should immediately be reported to the Administrator .

The administrator will issue a memo to the college cash counter through the student. The student should make the payment at the cash counter for the damages done. The above applies to the undesired graffiti on desks, walls and Boards

Suggestions & Complaints

Suggestions are always welcome in the mode of signed notes in the letter box. Complaints may be registered to the concerned authorities depending on the nature of grievance. No anonymous complaints or suggestions will be taken up for action.

Library/Music & sports equipment's

Students can avail Library books at the prescribed library hours using their ID card.

Using of Musical instruments and sports equipment are allowed at the prescribed hours. A student should enter his details in the register/record book, and submit the ID card to the concerned coordinators.

E. Sanctioned leave, late arrival and early departure

- Get the signature from respective faculty and from the principal
- Regularity record in the handbook must also be signed by the Principal

Absence due to family function


Follow the above mentioned procedure but this leave can be only sanctioned provided you apply in anticipation of the family function

- Attach your medical certificate (in case of absence for more than 3 days) with the form

Late arrival/Uniform

- Pay the stipulated fine at the college office
- Write your reason for being late, meet the Principal and make an entry in your handbook


